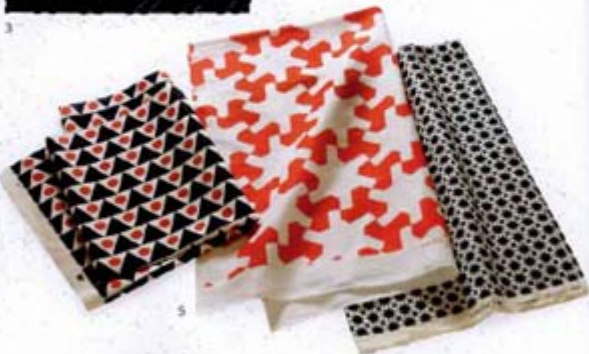

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WHAT'S NEW TO THE TRADE—FABRICS, FURNISHINGS, AND FABULOUS FINDS

Finished in matte black, the chair measures 42" w. x 27" d. x 24" h. and has a black-ped- or stainless-steel base, both shown. 212-633-0452; ralphpucci.net. 2 The Balzac dining table by Robert Marinelli pairs two sumptuous materials that recall French designs of the 1930s and '40s: The top and base are cased walnut, and the pedestal is hammered cast bronze.
